 Hope Community Support

Today, Tiffany works full-time and earns a consistent paycheck and benefits for her eight-year old daughter, Nevaeh, and herself. But only a year ago, things were looking very bleak for Tiffany and Nevaeh.

Tiffany was injured in an abusive relationship and was unable to work. She remembers the stress of not knowing where they would sleep each night, and how she felt like she wasn't caring for her daughter.

Then Tiffany heard about the Catholic Charities Hope Community Support Program and they helped her get a housing voucher for an apartment.

Having a home helped her gain more self-confidence and start working again.

Tiffany would like to thank supporters of United Way. After only one year of working with Hope, she is now able to pay for her rent on her own. And when she is able, Tiffany plans to give back to the community that has supported her and Nevaeh through a very difficult time.

Ranji

For Ranji, supporting United Way for the last 25 years has been a personal journey.

Ranji was working at Coborn's in 1991 when he was inspired to get involved. A speaker came and told stories about the impact United Way has on the community. Those stories brought back memories from his childhood when his own family had fallen on tough times.

Ranji's father lost his job and United Way supported his family. He remembers receiving food, clothing and toys at Christmas.

"This was my opportunity to give back to the community that gave me so much," said Ranji. He believes that everyone who is able should reach out and give because hard times can fall on anyone.

United Way of Central Minnesota fights for students living in poverty and works to reduce barriers to their success.

United Way believes that supporting parents will reduce stress at home and improve children's chances for long-term education and employment. To do so, United Way has developed Neighborhood Resource Centers at Lincoln Elementary and Discovery Community School — where **Community Resource Navigators are employed to help families find employment, access affordable childcare, utilize emergency basic needs services, negotiate legal issues, resolve outstanding medical bills, and register for insurance.**
